LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES

'Letting Go' and 'Holding On'

The season of Lent invites us to refocus our spiritual life...to re-attune to God, as we prayerfully examine our priorities, actions, thoughts and expectations.

Often we give something up for Lent as a way of reminding us daily of Jesus' sacrifice. We might also take on additional spiritual practices or acts of service so as to follow Jesus more closely.

What might we "let go" this season and to what should we "hold on?" Each week of Lent offers us the opportunity to *let go* of that which distracts from discerning God's presence and instead *hold on* to that which God promises.



Noah has a new tumor in his brain and possibly two additional tumors in his cervical spine. The locations are different this time which may be good from a radiation perspective, but also make things a little bit more difficult for surgery. We have limited information at this time about what's going to happen moving forward. It's excruciating to not know what our options may be, but soon we will have some answers.

What we do know is Noah is a fighter and he's already beaten cancer twice. Also, that Nick and I will only accept the most optimistic of treatment plans, which we're hoping come from CHOP when they receive the MRI images from this morning. I cannot believe we're about to go down this road again and the thought of putting Noah through so much pain literally hurts my heart, but I have faith that he will come out on top again. $\fill N$
